There is ample parking around the club for cars and trailers.









Weather condition



In June weather is usually fine and warm, with high temperatures between 22° and 27° Celsius.

Prevailing Southern breeze is stable in daytime between 10 and 20 knots

Occasionally Western winds blow from 8 to 20 knots. Tidal excursion is minimal (30 cm) and current is light (less than 0,5 knots).

Racing area is close to the Club with plenty of space in the vast area among Lilibeo Point, Aegadian Islands and the Stagnone lagoon.










Accommodation




In the vicinity of the Club several different accommodations are available.

Transport Access to Marsala


Marsala can be easily accessed by plane, by ferry or by car


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Marsala City centre

City centre is about 1 km from the Club. Walking from the Capo Lilibeo, one passes through a grand Renaissance arch, the Porta Nuova, and enters the "pedestrian zone," surrounding the historic center.

The heart of Marsala is the piazza in front of the town's Duomo, which is dedicated to St. Thomas Becket. This square, called Piazza Loggia, is a pleasant place for a promenade or refreshments at the cafe opposite the cathedral.

Look out for the fabulous lion's head over the gateway through which Garibaldi led his men, now called the Porta Garibaldi. Other fine palazzi and ornate balconies dot the long narrow streets of the town center. One of the most elegant buildings is the town hall, alongside the Duomo.

The town has a huge number of bars and restaurants.

A typical evening out would be no more than €20 a person, fresh pizza at €6, some splendid fresh fish dishes and of course the local wine at very reasonable prices. It's safe to say that you could eat out at a different restaurant every day, for lunch and dinner.

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Stagnone lagoon is a Natural Reserve in which is located the island of Mozia. It is famous also for the salt ponds and the windmills
























Near Marsala Motya

Motya (Italian: Mozia) was an ancient and powerful city on an island off the west coast of Sicily, settled for nearly four centuries by the Phoenicians The island of Mozia (10 km North of Marsala) is owned and operated by the Whitaker Foundation, famous for Marsala wines. Tours are available for the small museum, and the well-preserved ruins of a

crossroads civilisation.



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Segesta is an archaeological site 50 km from Marsala where lies an unusually well preserved Greek Doric temple and a scenographic theatre

Marsala

One of the highlights of visiting Sicily is eating out.

Sicilian cuisine is arguably the most varied and fascinating of any Italian region and there is always an abundance of choice when you decide to head out for a meal.









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Marsala wine

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Marsala is a wine, dry or sweet, produced in the region surrounding the Italian city of Marsala, similar to Port, Madeira and Sherry.

The English trader John Woodhouse in 1773 landed at the port of Marsala and discovered the local wine, introducing it in England.

Marsala proved so successful that Woodhouse returned to Sicily and, in 1796, began its mass production and commercialization.

Marsala contains about 15–20% alcohol by volume. Different Marsala wines are classified according to their color, sweetness, and the duration of their aging.







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




Marsala Other local wines

Blessed with consistently bright sunshine and reliably moderate rainfall, Sicily's classic Mediterranean climate is ideally suited to the production of wine grapes. Sicily is now one of Italy's most interesting wine regions.

Key grape varieties used in Sicilian viticulture are a combination of 'native' varieties and newer, more fashionable imports, for a production of red and white wines rich in taste and perfumes.

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Marsala Cantine Florio

The historic Florio Cellars are located at 1,5 km from the Club. The guided tour of the Florio Cellars begins with the gigantic vats, then the actual Cellar, an evocative, magical place where about 5,500,000 litres of Marsala are preserved.

The Donna Franca Tasting Room follows where a tasting of different Marsala wines and local products is a moment of pleasure.

The tour concludes in the Florio Enoteca, a state of the art wine shop, unique in Italy, that contains the entire range of wines, as well as a selection of some of Sicily's best handicrafts products and local delicacies.



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
